The formation of the NHL... Eddie did it!

To understand the reason for the creation of the NHL in November of 1917, a look at the previous season is necessary.









The 1916-17 National Hockey Association's final season began on "thin ice". That is, the World War had begun and the league lost many talented players to the forces, notably the prolific scorer, Frank McGee. Short staffed by not only the war effort, but also by the new league in the west, the Pacific Coast Hockey Association, which recruited the eastern players. Another problem occurred when Toronto player, Cy Denneny, secured a job in Ottawa (they had jobs in those days) and asked his team's owner, the feisty Eddie Livingstone, for a transfer. When the Toronto boss virtually denied the transfer by asking too much in return, the players union threatened to strike, thus potentially shutting down the league. Denneny was also prepared to simply sit out the season. Later, Livingstone reduced his demands and the league carried on. However, in February, a popular top team composed of Canadian servicemen, the 228th Battalion, was suddenly called overseas, reducing the league to 5 teams, Montreal Canadiens, Wanderers, Ottawa, Quebec and Toronto. The ensuing heated arguments between the owners on methods of completing the league resolved very little. When the fiery Eddie Livingstone had his proposal on rescheduling the remaining games totally rejected by the other owners, he immediately pulled his Toronto team from the league. The four remaining teams limped to completion of their season.

These events led to the creation of the NHL for the 1917 - 18 season. The four remaining owners from the previous season held sometimes "discreet" meetings to organize the ensuing season and to possibly rid themselves of the proverbial thorn, Eddie Livingston. In their final meeting, the owners created a new league, the National Hockey League, comprised of the same old four teams from the NHA plus a new entry from Toronto. They claimed Mr. Livingstone still had his franchise and his league to play in, but his was the only team. Without Eddie, where would the NHL be...?
