The Lorne Park Varsity Girls Lacrosse team went undefeated in ROPSSAA play capturing our 10th Championship in the last 12 seasons. Our bigger success is the story of our graduating goaltender Alexa Ramirez-Gaston. Alexa joined us as a grade 11 athlete, never having played any school sports. She overheard me discussing a goalie shortage in our program and asked if she could tryout. Reluctantly, I invited her to try, warning her that lacrosse balls hurt and it would be her job to step in front of these projectiles resulting in multiple bruises.

Alexa stepped in with ferocious intensity and helped our team to a ROPSSAA title in 2016. Last year she shared the sting of losing to a very good Mayfield team in the semi-finals and committed herself to returning as a 12B player to reclaim the ROPSSAA trophy. This year she proved to be one of the top goalies in the Province, surrendering only 25 Goals Against in 10 ROPSSAA contests. That is a staggering 2.5 Goals Against Average in a sport that considers 9 GAA excellent.

More importantly, Alexa has matured into an academic success with several opportunities to choose from for post-secondary school. She credits her involvement in lacrosse as the catalyst for her personal and academic growth over the last 3 years. Senior Girls 4x100m Relay

The 4x100m relay is one of the most exciting races to watch in all of track and field. St. Edmund Campion's track and field team has had a ton of success in the event at the ROPSSAA championships since 2005 winning gold in the event an amazing 24 times over all age divisions. Within that time Campion has held the ROPSSAA record for the Midget girls and boys, Junior girls and boys and the Senior boys.

Holding a regional record is very prestigious and highly looked upon by other athletes as well as secondary and post-secondary schools. Campion's performance in the senior girls' 4x100m has been nothing short of exceptional winning 4 gold, 1 silver and 1 bronze over the past 10 years. But for the longest time it has been the only ROPSSAA 4x100m record that the school has not held.

In 2012, the team of **Keiana Palmer, Naomi Kerr, Khadijah Thompson and Nita Patterson-Reid dominated** the provincial circuit culminating in an OFSAA championship. But their time at ROPSSAA of 49.77 wasn't fast enough to claim the time of 49.16 held by St. Marcellinus one year earlier.

Fast forward 2 years to 2014. Campion fielded another OFSAA championship team that went undefeated the entire season, winning every competition that they were entered in. Unfortunately, due to scheduling conflicts an electric timer wasn't used at the ROPSSAA championships that year, so the record breaking hand time of 48.50 set by **Faith Brown, Sade McCreath, LeShe Wedderburn and Chyna Watson-Reid** would not count as an official record.

In 2018, **Kataya Clarke, Kariah Lyttle, Mya Hastings and Jazmine Oliver** finally gave St. Edmund Campion what they were missing for many years. The senior girls 4x100m relay ROPSSAA record. They ran a record breaking time of 48.86 seconds to win the gold and the title of fastest senior girls 4x100m relay team in ROPSSAA history.


