

## Swimming

The John Fraser Jaguars Swim Team has enjoyed an incredibly successful ROPSSAA and post-ROPSSAA season - the most successful season in Jaguars swimming history. The team took home 3 ROPSSAA championship trophies - Junior Boys, Senior Girls, and Overall Team. The team won a total of 51 medals and awards including 14 gold medals, 6 silver medals, and 7 bronze medals. Team member, Christian Florea, set a ROPSSAA record in the Open Boys 200m Freestyle. The post-ROPSSAA season was also successful for the Jaguars with 16 swimmers representing John Fraser at the OFSAA competition. The team earned 2 Gold medals, 2 silver medals, and a bronze medal as well as had a number of swimmers place in finals. The Jaguars OFSAA Swim Team also won the Junior Boys Champion banner - the fist OFSAA banner in any sport for John Fraser - and placed 10th overall at OFSAA, with the Senior Girls team placing 5th in their division. Special thanks to our team Manager Hazel J. (grade 11) who kept spirits high and brought her positive energy and support to the bench every game.






