With two years away from basketball and hope for a season waning, our boys remained resilient and ready to play their first season of high school basketball. Once restrictions were lifted the season was fast and furious and the boys had to quickly acclimate to the expectations and culture of the St. Martin Basketball program. With every practice and game the boys exhibited growth and began to realize their potential. The boys finished the season with a perfect 6 - 0 record and earned the # 1 seed. The boys defeated Robert F. Hall in the quarterfinals and St. Roch in the semi-finals. In the finals, in front of a roaring home crowd, the boys faced St. Marguerite d'Youville who held an 11 point lead with 3:12 left in the game. The boys put their resilience and resolve on display making an incredible 15 - 0 run to end the game and capture the 2022 Junior Boys ROPSSAA Championship 66 - 63! It was a complete team effort with Nathan Underwood scoring 17 points, Kent Lingat 14 points, Richmond Mbanugo 14 points, and Jayden Pittiman with 12 points. Three months ago the Mayfield girls rugby team got together with one goal in mind: to defend the OFSAA gold medal they won in 2019. Only, after being away from athletics because of Covid, even the prospect of having a team, let alone a junior and senior team, seemed improbable. Not to mention the fact that they would technically only have one returning player from that championship team.



With a handful of athletes with rugby experience, and a large group of girls, although keen and athletic, wholly uninitiated to the physical demands of the sport, set out on that daunting but unlikely goal.

After weeks of practice, in all matter of conditions that spring in Ontario holds, the girls started their season with an exhibition game with Humberview. With a strong initiation to the sport it was obvious there was a fire ignited within them. They would roll through their regular ROPSSAA season gaining confidence with every tackle, ruck and scrum.

The girls learned a lot about themselves as individuals, athletes and teammates - rugby players - as they faced the difficult task of winning their pool at the Centennial Cup in Guelph, and a ROPSSAA final played at home. That was all the strength they needed to take to face the best schools in Ontario at the OFSAA finals hosted in Waterloo.

There are so many factors that make the OFSAA tournament so difficult to win: the quality of players, coaches and programs, the physicality and sheer number of games you need to play, the travel, distractions, being away from home - the heat.

The Mayfield Mavericks would show tremendous determination, focus, and composure to win their games - none of them easy and all with myriad challenges. They persevered through the heat, through the demand on their bodies, the stress and fatigue, to do what they had set out to do remarkably only a few months prior - to win OFSAA, but in doing so they would accomplished so much more than that: The Mayfield Girls Rugby team won OFSAA gold the only way they could have - together.

Coaches Wiwchar, Ireland, Theo, Tutty and Manning are so proud of what all the girls, regardless of their role on the team, accomplished this year in spite of everything stacked against them. They are looking forward to working with all those girls coming back next year and would like to send our best wishes to those graduating players.


